

50 Years on Strawberry Point

Golden Gate Baptist Theological Seminary opened the doors to its Northern California Campus in Mill Valley fifty years ago, in September 1959, after six years of planning and construction. The 148 acres of former dairy land called Strawberry Point became home to the first Southern Baptist seminary in the west, and today the five-campus system is known as the 10th largest seminary in the United States.

OS CASTE BAPTIST Celebrating 50 years on Strawberry Point, Golden Gate Seminary enjoys a heritage that is rich in western history. The Seminary's roots can be traced to California's Gold Rush days when the population on the West coast was exploding.

Isam B. Hodges was a student at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in 1924 when he first considered the challenge of a western seminary. As pastor of Golden Gate Baptist Church in Oakland, California, he acted on his vision and the charter was issued

for Golden Gate Southern Baptist Theological Seminary on July 24, 1944. Classes began on September 4 of that year, with 16 students. Hodges was the first president and the instructors served without pay. Benjamin O. Herring was elected the second president in 1946, and it was during his tenure that the Seminary moved its campus to Berkeley, into

a three-story brick building at Grove and Addison streets. The Seminary graduated 17 students in its first graduating class in 1949.

Harold K. Graves became the first president to be named after adoption by the Southern Baptist Convention, which took place in 1950 after years of waiting. For the next quarter-century under Graves' leadership, Golden Gate would undergo dramatic changes which would

allow it to become one of the finest theological seminaries in the world.

Under Graves' direction, the Seminary purchased a large piece of land in 1953 on Strawberry Point in Marin County, six miles north of the famous Golden Gate Bridge. The 148 acres was once the proposed site for the United Nations building. The beautiful park-like campus was opened on July 1, 1959 and classes were held in September of that year for the first time on Strawberry Point, just

eleven miles from where Harvey Gilbert attempted to begin a theological school 100 years before. With the new campus, Graves sought out a strong faculty and, in 1961, the Seminary gained full accreditation. In 1973, during Graves' presidency, the Southern California Campus opened in Orange County.


April 1946 - B.O. Herring, a Bible professor at Baylor University, accepts the invitation to become the second president of Golden Gate Seminary.

1944 Five years after John Lewis Shuck be-

comes the first Southern Baptist missionary in California, his co-laborer Harvey Gilbert establishes the San Rafael Bible Institute at the corner of 4th and E Streets. Despite its good beginning, the fledgling school closes after a few years.



Upon Graves' retirement in 1977, William M. Pinson, Jr. became president. Under his leadership, new student housing and a new library were constructed, and enrollment continued to increase. In 1979 Pinson negotiated with Oscar Romo to establish what is now known as Contextualized Leadership Development (CLD), an educational outreach program providing quality,



Bible-based ministry training in geographically convenient and contextualized settings. Today 55 CLD centers operate throughout North America, currently taught in 19 states and 7 languages. In 1980, during Pinson's presidency, the Pacific Northwest Campus was established in Vancouver, Washington.

Franklin D. Pollard was inaugurated as the fifth president in 1983. During his three-year tenure, the Seminary experienced significant enrollment growth. Pollard resigned in 1986 to become pastor of First Baptist Church, Jackson, Mississippi. Upon his departure, Graves returned as interim president.

In 1986, William O. Crews became the sixth president of Golden Gate. During Crews' tenure, the Seminary established two new campuses in Phoenix, Arizona in 1995 and Denver, Colorado in 1996. The Seminary also achieved accreditation approval to offer full master-level degrees at all five of the Seminary's campuses.

The Seminary's current president, Jeff P. Iorg, previously served as a pastor in Missouri and Oregon, and as the Executive Director/Treasurer of the Northwest Baptist Convention, prior to his election in 2004. Under his leadership, the Seminary launched the Partners for the Future Campaign (reaching one of its financial goals 18 months ahead of schedule), established the eCampus (which

offers fully-accredited, master-level courses 100% online), re-launched and re-formatted the Seminary's electronic communication tools (website makeover including a blog and a bi-monthly e-newsletter). He facilitated the rebuilding of the playground and creation of wireless capabilities for the entire Northern California Campus academic facilities. Dr. Iorg continues to lead the Seminary - while publishing three books, maintaining an extensive speaking ministry, and managing a personal ministry with baseball organizations.

Since its founding, Golden Gate Seminary has expanded its influence beyond its vast 11-state region and has conferred degrees on 7,041 men and women, many of whom are now involved in strategic ministries all over the globe as pastors, missionaries, chaplains, educators, and administrators in Christian service. Once a fledgling institution that began in a small church in Oakland, the vibrant Northern California Campus is now the nerve center for a seminary system that reflects its visionary heritage.

April 1947 – California Baptists approve the purchase of property for the burgeoning Seminary. Its new Berkeley location, a former lodge building purchased from Calvary Baptist Church, is located at Grove and Addison Streets.

Anecdotes and Memories

From the Golden Grads of 1949-1959

"In the early days of the Seminary, when something needed to be built or repaired, students pitched in and helped. On one occasion, Hardy Childress and I were called on to help install a new gas furnace to replace the old oil burner. Hardy had to go for additional parts, and while awaiting his return, I inspected the gaping hole where the old furnace had tied onto the heat ducts. I was amazed how far I could see up into the heart of the building. On impulse, I checked out the acoustics by mewing like a kitten. The sound echoed back and forth. I mewed several times. Because Hardy still had not returned, I decided to go home.

"What I did not know at the time was that the first duct was in the side room next to President Herring's office and he was entertaining a guest. They both heard the 'kitten' and were convinced it was trapped in the heat duct and needed to be rescued. They went to the basement and for half an hour tried to coax that kitten out.

"Believe me, I never told Dr. Herring I was that cat!"

Sam N. Jones, class of 1950

"There were two doctors who had regular office hours for the Seminary students and staff. Dr. John Binkley was an OB/GYN and Dr. John Lee was a GP. We all went to see them for checkups or any medical needs, including pregnancies. I used to tell people my kids were \$50 a piece, because that was all we paid, while the Seminary insurance paid the rest."

Nancy Graves McLaughlin

(husband Homer, class of 1962)

"I worked in the library during my three years as a student. Grace Jackson, a trained librarian, was my supervisor and later became the first salaried librarian of the Seminary.



"Mrs. Jackson told me I needed a 'Cutter Table' for the library and I presented the matter to the president, Dr. B.O. Herring. He also served as the Chancellor, Chief Financial

Officer and bookkeeper and was constantly 'walking a tight rope' to bring in enough money for Seminary expenses. The Seminary had little or no steady income at the time and depended on whatever money Dr. Herring could bring in.

"When I mentioned the matter of the 'Cutter Table' to Dr. Herring, he told me to write for the price, which I did. When I presented the price to him, something less than ten dollars, he was astounded while I was at a complete loss to understand why. He replied that it would 'cost a fortune' to have that shipped across the country. When it finally dawned on me that he was thinking about a piece of furniture, I told him a 'Cutter Table' was a book. It was a chart for alphabetizing authors' names numerically – i.e. a 'table'. The author's name was 'Cutter,' hence 'Cutter Table'. I doubt that any other incident could be more illustrative of the financial situation of the Seminary at that time."

"When I started at Golden Gate Seminary in 1947, many of the students were ex-military men attending under the G.I. Bill. We were family men and lived in a low-cost housing project in Richmond, California. To conserve costs and time, we shared rides to the Seminary, with four or five to the car. Each day en route to and from the Seminary, we would discuss what we had learned in the various classes that day. Sometimes the temper of the discussions became rather heated. We got a double exposure to all the material."

"The Seminary had

a football team. In 1952, we played Berkeley Baptist Divinity School, and we won. We had a basketball team for several years. One year our coach was Dr. Fred Fisher, who taught New Testament and was one of the favorite professors.

"Many of the students

worked while going to school, and several of us worked nearby in Emeryville at General Cable Corp. We called it 'Generous' Cable because they hired a lot of the students. We could work the night shifts or swing shifts, and then still attend classes."

Quick Facts **About Strawberry Point**

- ✓ The undeveloped land known as Strawberry Point was often described as "a great bear rug spread on the surface of Richardson Bay."
- ✓ Strawberry Point was considered as the site for the United Nations, had the institution been established on the west coast.
- ✓ Golden Gate's first semester as a Southern Baptist institution, in the fall of 1950, was marked by an enrollment of 177 students.
- ✓ In 1950, Golden Gate students baptized 466 people in student-led churches as well as started 14 new churches and 27 missions.
- ✓ In 1959, Marin County required Golden Gate Seminary to construct a road around the western edge of Strawberry Point at a cost of more than \$135,000. The road was appropriately named Seminary Drive.
- ✓ The stone and bronze gate at the main entrance to the Northern California campus was funded by alumni.
- ✓ The twelve-foot width of the halls in the academic building was mandated by the California state fire marshal and based on the anticipated 1959 enrollment of over 2000 students at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary.
- ✓ The Seminary was accredited by the American Association of Theological Schools (ATS) in December 1961.
- ✓ Dr. and Mrs. H. I. Hester, of Liberty, MO, endowed the Hester Lectures. The first lecture was delivered in March 1969 by Theodore F. Adams.
- ✓ The Doctor of Ministry program was added to the curriculum in 1972.
- ✓ The first Deere Lecture, named for former Old Testament faculty member Derward Deere, was delivered in 1971 by Wayne E. Ward.

"In 1955 about 15 students put in \$150 each and bought a Cessna 120 with metalized wings. We formed the Baptist Missionary Pilots Association (BMPTA) and I believe we incorporated. The plane we bought was white with red trim. After the Seminary moved to Mill Valley we bought another plane. I had to drop out of the BMPTA because I went broke trying to fly. Is the group still in existence?"

Pat Lewellyn, class of 1960

"In 1954, James and I drove out from Kentucky in a Chevrolet with a trailer, bringing our four kids and everything we owned, in order for James to receive a Seminary education. When we got to the old Masonic building in Berkeley, we spoke to Dr. Graves. After our conversation, he told the Registrar, 'Enroll these people.' Then someone helped us find an apartment. James worked swing shift at the General Cable Corp. in Emeryville, and went to school four days a week. He went to the skid row missions in San Francisco every Saturday night. In order for those down and out to receive a meal, they had to listen to the sermon. Often, it was James who preached. I recall serving a lunch at the dedication of the groundbreaking of Strawberry Point."

Geneva Dunn (husband James, class of 1957)

"While a full-time student, I worked for a candy factory and for General Cable Corp. in Emeryville. My wife, Eloise and I had four children while I was going to Seminary. She also attended classes, but didn't get a degree. We lived in government housing in Oakland, underneath the freeway; then moved to a house in Berkeley. The professors who affected me the most were Dr. Fisher, who taught New Testament, and Dr. Carlton, who was a church history professor. One of the highlights was Billy Graham speaking at our commencement ceremony, in May 1958."

Max Kell, class of 1958

"I remember wandering over the campus as it was being built, sitting on the concrete floor of what would later be offices and practice rooms, and swinging our legs (with my sister and the Fisher girls), and looking at San Francisco. I collected the silver 'coins' that were found all over the construction site (punch-outs of pipes and other metal). I think we also helped plant a tree or two (or at least watched)."

"I came to GGBTS as a bride in 1951. My favorite memory was an Old Testament class under Dr. Deere. He shared events of their 'Tweetie bird' with us, along with making the Old Testament come alive and relevant.

"Seven of us were pregnant at the time. As soon as our son was born in 1952, we moved to the church field. Those days were hard ones financially, but God was always faithful to provide."

"As a seminary wife, I attended a seminary wives organization headed by Mrs. Aulick, Dr. Aulick's wife. She chose our name 'Lamba Delta Sigma'. Oh me, we were referred to as the 'LDS Club.'

"I served as President of the club one year and fearfully took baby son Merril to visit in their home and plan for meetings. We all joyfully survived.

"Thank you for allowing me a P.H.T. (Pushing Hubby Through) award from the Seminary!"

Joyce Smoak (husband Alfred, Jr., class of 1955)

"When I attended Golden Gate, there were too many girls for all to live in the main dorm, so four of us lived above the cafeteria. We called it 'Angels' Annex.' We had no excuse for being late for classes.

"Some of my best memories were in conducting classes with Dr. Carlyle Bennett. He was adamant about the way you announced the hymn number. If you said '250' everyone turned to that number while you directed, but if you said '200 and 50' part of the class would turn to 200 and rest would turn to 50. Mrs. Orine Suffern, the pianist, might turn to either. It made for some fun and interesting times."


August 1996 – Golden Gate's Rocky Mountain Campus begins classes in Denver, CO.

September 2004 – Jeff P. lorg is inaugurated as the seventh president of the Seminary. He came to Mill Valley from the Northwest Baptist Convention in Vancouver, WA, where he served as Executive Director/Treasurer.



"Many people may not remember me and for good reason: I attended Golden Gate Seminary for only eight months. In 1953, I was pastoring a half-time church in East Texas while attending Baylor. Gradually I began to formulate an opinion that my ministry as a pastor, following training, might one day find me in the West. I never lost that vision.

"I finished Baylor and went directly to Southwestern Seminary. In 1958 I felt persuaded to transfer to Golden Gate for my final year in order to find out what Western Missions were all about.

"When I enrolled at Golden Gate, I was unaware of the move from Berkeley to Marin County, but because of the move, commencement would take place in April of 1959.

"I spent eight happy months on the Berkeley campus, and when I received my degree (a D.D. which was soon commuted to an M.Div.), my wife and I moved without delay to the pastorate of a church in Loveland, Colorado.

"Dr. Graves, President of Golden Gate at the time, spoke at the annual meeting of the Colorado Baptist General Convention that fall. He said, 'Charles Bass did not get his total seminary education at Golden Gate, but we did put the curl in his tail."

Charles D. Bass, class of 1959

"Some of us who had come from mid-America were not very familiar with earthquakes, and were bug-eyed when a rather strong quake struck Berkeley in the midfifties, and rattled the Calvary Church/Seminary building. The evidence was graphic when we looked at the long crack in the plaster on the wall of the auditorium. That was part

"One of the professors, when asked a question, always replied, 'That is a good question.' Yet he never did answer any question. My favorite teacher was Dr. Aulick. Times were tough but God provided. The Seminary and faculty struggled but persevered. It was a happy three years for me."

"In 1954 I was drafted as social vice president of the student body. Jerry, my wife-to-be, was a natural to help me plan the 'program' aspects of a get-acquainted party, a Mission Tea and the Seminary Banquet. We honored Dr. and Mrs. Harold Graves as the King and Queen (kept it a secret from them, too!) at the banquet, entitled 'Ye Royal Banquet!' All the entertainment and program was in their honor. Dr. Graves was our Seminary president, our pastor, and a good friend.

"During those days, everyone knew everyone else. We were serious about our studies, but also had a lot of fun. During the 1954-1955 academic year there were 17 marriages and/or engagements!

"Jerry and I became engaged in June 1955 and married a year later. We've shared many ministries together during the past 53 years. There were a lot of blessings at Golden Gate. The most memorable one to me was starting a life together that has lasted many years."

Dr. B.O. Herring Comes to the Seminary

A Golden Grad's Story

I had a unique involvement in the coming of Dr. Herring as president. It was during the spring semester of 1946, when I was one of only two students at Golden Gate Baptist Theological Seminary, that Dr. Herring resigned from his professorship in the Bible Department at Baylor University. I had studied under him at Baylor.

When Brother H.H. Stagg, my Evangelism professor at Golden Gate, heard about Herring's resignation from Baylor, he asked me to write Dr. Herring and ask him to come to California for a look at "the work" before he made a commitment to any other calling. I was dumbfounded to think that my invitation would be worthy of any consideration, especially with no promise of any financial assistance for the trip. Almost with the tone of a spoiled child, I responded to this preposterous proposal: "I can't do that! What could I tell him?" With the calmest confidence Brother Stagg said, "Tell him about 'the work' and tell him about the Seminary. Ask him to 'come and see' for himself."

I tried to pass on to Dr. Herring some understanding of what we were about in California, why the Seminary was such a vital part of it and simply asked that he "come and see." I told him that I was writing at Brother Stagg's request and that Brother Stagg wanted him as a houseguest during his stay in California. I really didn't expect to hear more than a courteous

acknowledgement of the letter with a pledge to pray for us in such a challenging field of service. In about ten days, I was almost tearfully overjoyed when I met Brother Stagg in Evangelism class with a letter in hand from Dr. Herring. He thanked me for my letter to him, said he was impressed by what I told him, and said he was deeply impressed by the Holy Spirit to "come and see." After Brother Stagg read the letter, he said, "It pays to trust the Lord, doesn't it? Let's thank God for what He is doing."

The week that Dr. Herring was in the Bay Area passed rapidly. Dr. Herring conducted a revival and spoke in the Seminary chapel services one morning. All the Baptist pastors in the area attended the service along with the Seminary faculty and the two students.

In the Friday Evangelism class, Brother Stagg made another request of me. Knowing I was to attend the Sunday School Convention in San Diego on Monday, he gave me the names of the Seminary Board of Trustees who were on the faculty committee and said, "You get them together down there and tell them to get in touch with Dr. Herring before he leaves California."

We had another episode of "I can't do that" and "Who's going to listen to a first-year seminary student on an important matter like this?" Brother Stagg countered with "You brought him out here, didn't you?" Only two of the five faculty committee members were at the Sunday School Convention. I was able to get those two together and made my presentation. They withdrew from me for a brief conference, then mo-


tioned me to join them. One of them wrote out a message and said, "Send this telegram to Dr. Herring and sign my name." In that meeting, Dr. Herring was called as President of the Seminary.

When I get to heaven I'm going to ask Brother Stagg why area missionaries stay in the background and do not take the credit for some of the beautiful things they do. I still feel singularly blessed for the small part I had in the life of the Seminary, and the marvelous privilege of association with deeply-dedicated Christians who literally gave themselves in the California effort.

New Building at Golden Gate's Arizona Campus



Founded in 1995 as a partnership between Golden Gate Seminary and the Arizona Southern Baptist Convention (ASBC), the Arizona Campus is currently located in a building shared with, and provided by, the ASBC in Scottsdale. The facility has one large classroom which seats 40 students, two smaller classrooms and limited office and library space.

The Arizona Southern Baptist Convention approved a building project to provide for the growth of the Arizona Campus and other educational strategies of the Convention. The new plan includes 14,000 sq. ft. of classroom, library, administrative and interactive space for students. The facility will be built adjacent to the current building in Scottsdale and construction will begin once the funds are raised. No Cooperative Program funds will be used, nor debt incurred, to build the facility.

The estimated cost of the project is \$2 million with \$350,000 committed to date. For more information, contact arc-info@ggbts.edu.

College Students Volunteer



Oscar Romo, Golden Gate Seminary's CLD Founder Dies



Oscar I. Romo, a pioneer in ethnic evangelism and church planting, died January 16 of pneumonia related to Parkinson's disease.

"Romo had a vision to train ethnics to start churches, to develop into pastors, to become missionaries," recalled Don Beall, Golden Gate Seminary's CLD Direc-

tor. "In 1979 he negotiated with Dr. Bill Pinson, then the Seminary's president, to partner to establish Ethnic Leadership Development (ELD), which is now known as Contextualized Leadership Development (CLD)."

Romo was the Southern Baptists' first non-Anglo elected to a national leadership position. For 25 years, Romo led efforts in evangelism and church planting among the nation's growing multi-cultural groups.

Two years ago, during the annual meeting of the Southern Baptist Convention in San Antonio, Romo was honored by Hispanic Southern Baptists for his nearly 50 years of strategy development and work with non-Anglo groups, dating back to his first pastorate in 1948 until his retirement in 1995.

During that era Southern Baptist multi-cultural congregations grew from less than 1,000 to 9,000. His ground-breaking work helped establish the denomination as the nation's most ethnically-diverse faith group, a position it maintains today.

Beall described Romo's influence with an example. "One Hispanic pastor in Southern California graduated from CLD and began a Spanish Southern Baptist Church. That church now runs 2,300 on Sunday, and is sending out other church planters. All because God gave Oscar Romo a vision to train men and women in their language, where they lived, starting where they were. What a vision!"

Frank Pollard, Former Golden Gate President Dies



Dr. Frank Pollard, former president of Golden Gate Seminary and pastor of First Baptist Church, Jackson, Mississippi, died at his home in San Anselmo, California on Sunday, November 30, 2008.

Dr. Pollard was the fifth president of Golden Gate Seminary, serving

from 1983-1986. He led in the redevelopment of the Northern California campus master plan and enrollment at the Seminary grew significantly during his tenure. He left in 1986 to become pastor of First Baptist Church, Jackson, Mississippi, a position he held previously from 1974-1980.

"Dr. Pollard was a great advocate for Golden Gate," said the Seminary's current president, Dr. Jeff Iorg. "I appreciated his support and encouragement of the Seminary community." He noted that Dr. Pollard had recently relocated back to California with his wife, the former Jane Shepard.

Dr. John Shouse, professor of Christian Theology, said of Dr. Pollard, "In word and life, he reflected the grace and truth of the gospel. He was the consummate minister's minister. Quite simply, he gave the Lord his best."

A native of Texas, Dr. Pollard was featured in *Time* magazine in 1979 as one of seven leading Protestant preachers in America. In addition to First Baptist Church of Jackson, Mississippi, his pastorates included First Baptist Church, San Antonio, Texas, and Shiloh Terrace Baptist Church, Dallas, Texas. Golden Gate Seminary honored Dr. Pollard with the Distinguished Service Award in 1993.

In 1976, Dr. Pollard became the preacher for "The Baptist Hour," produced by the Radio and Television Commission of the Southern Baptist Convention. Dr. Pollard also hosted the radio and television program, "At Home with the Bible," from 1978-1984.

Dr. Pollard, who wrote five books during his career, was born in Olney, Texas on February 25, 1934. He was a graduate of Texas A&M University, Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, and held a Doctor of Ministry degree from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary. California Baptist University and Mississippi College awarded him honorary doctorates.

Lila Fae Vance Langford Butler Goodbye to Longtime Seminary Friend



Lila Fae Vance Langford Butler, a member of the Golden Gate Seminary original faculty, died on January 1, 2009. Butler had a long, close relationship with the Seminary, having served on the founding music faculty, and as secretary to President B.O. Herring. In 1950, she earned a Bach-

elor of Sacred Music degree from the Seminary.

Married to and widowed by two California Southern Baptist pastors, Butler was recognized in the early days of the Convention as the Pastor's Wife of the Year by the Southern Baptist Convention of California. 


